HOW TO MAKE A SUCCULENT WREATH

SUCCULENTS ARE A FANTASTIC DROUGHT TOLERANT PLANT TO USE INDOORS AND OUTDOORS. PLANT A SUCCULENT WREATH FOR A WHIMSICAL AND FESTIVE LOOK! SUCCULENTS COME IN A VARIETY OF SHAPES, SIZES AND COLORS AND THEY RETAIN WATER IN THEIR LEAVES, MAKING THEM A BRILLIANT LOW WATER NEED OPTION.

MATERIALS

1. METAL WREATH FORM
2. 4-10 SUCCULENTS

3. SOIL
4. MOSS

5. BURLAP
6. FERTILIZER

7. SPRAY BOTTLE
8. HOOK TO HANG



STEPS

BURLAP IT UP

CUT BURLAP INTO A WIDE STRIP AND LAYER IT SO THE BOTTOM AND SIDES OF THE WREATH ARE COVERED.

FILL WITH SOIL

FILL WREATH HALFWAY WITH SOIL, LEAVING ROOM FOR THE PLANTS AND MOSS.

FERTILIZE

SPRINKLE FERTILIZER OVER SOIL AND MIX IT IN A LITTLE.

ARRANGE

ARRANGE SUCCULENTS, MIXING COLORS AND SHAPES.

SET & WATER

PLACE WREATH FORM COVER ON, PULLING SUCCULENT LEAVES THROUGH WHERE NEEDED. WATER EACH SUCCULENT WELL.

COVER IT WITH MOSS

ARRANGE MOSS AROUND PLANTS AND WEAVE IT UNDER THE WREATH FORM COVER.

LAY IT DOWN

LAY THE WREATH HORIZONTAL FOR AT LEAST A WEEK TO HELP THE ROOTS TO BECOME ESTABLISHED.

HANG IT UP

HANG IN PARTIAL TO FULL SUN.

ESTABLISH

WATER WEEKLY WITH A SPRAY BOTTLE UNTIL ESTABLISHED.

MAINTAIN

REPLACE BURLAP, SOIL AND MOSS EVERY 2 - 3 YEARS.

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
